Hi Everyone,

We are nearing the 1 month-long lockdown period and many around my neighbourhood have thrown themselves into their gardens. I've never seen such manicured lawns and tidy sections. Building Code -Large

As we await the next phase of the lockdown, the second online course has started today for the Year 2 Auckland Council cohorts who have begun on the first 5 days of the Building Code Large workshop. They will be joined by the Year 2 Down Country cohorts from the 4-8 May to complete the 2nd week of this course with Peter Sparrow. Michael Belsham will also be presenting on fire safety requirements in the May workshop.

BCA course for Hamilton, Kapiti and Tasman - surveys

As the 2nd course begins one ends with the completion of the BCA course for the Hamilton, Kapiti and Tasman students. A reminder to those students to complete the student survey. Students are invited to complete a survey at the end of each course so we know what is working well and what areas can be improved on and how.

Regulatory Environment assessments

All student assessments have been marked and we are completing the final post moderation checks before grades are released to students after Anzac weekend (including feedback on their assessments).

Building Construction, Materials & Systems

After ANZAC weekend the 'Materials' 4-day workshop will be held for the Down Country cohorts from <u>Tuesday 28 April to Friday 1 May.</u> Patrick will be in contact closer to the time with details of when each cohort will connect with him and how the workshop will be managed.

The New Zealand Certificate in Building Regulatory Environment Level 4 (60 Credits)

In the last update we reference the NZ Certificate in Building Regulatory Environment which we are looking to offer later this year. It is a level 4 certificate, not level 6, and is going through NZQA for approvals.

This programme is designed for non-technical support roles in Councils like BCA/ TA administrators or those who provide non-technical administrative support services. It is a programme that aligns strongly with the Building Surveying L6 programme and is a steppingstone into it. It is delivered in much the same way with an In-Employment delivery mode and fully online this year. There are 10 face to face teaching days which can be done online as 3 workshops over 20 weeks.
